

MBCC - Judges List Criteria

A1 List

Persons who have previously been approved by the KC to award Challenge Certificates in the breed, have completed their first appointment and have the support of the Midlands Border Collie Club

A2 List

Persons who have the support of the Midlands Border Collie Club, fulfil the requirements of the A3 list, have been assessed in accordance with KC requirements and accepted by the KC for inclusion on the "A" list but have not yet given Challenge Certificates.

A3 - BREED SPECIALIST

Persons who have a minimum of 7 years experience in the breed and have the support of the Midlands Border Collie Club.

To have judged at least 1 Breed Club Show or 4 Breed Club Supported Entry Shows. To have judged the breed in a minimum of 40 Breed Classes with a minimum of 200 dogs.

To have attended a seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer and passed the relevant examination on KC Regulations and Judging Procedures.

To have attended a Conformation & Movement seminar given by a KC Accredited Trainer and been given a certificate of attendance.

To have attended and passed a Conformation & Movement "Hands-on Assessment" conducted by a KC Accredited Trainer.

To have attended at least 2 breed specific seminars, one of which must have been run in accordance with the KC Code of Best Practice, and to have passed a judging examination/assessment.

To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs when they gained their first entry into the KC Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances). To have stewarded at a minimum of 12 shows.

A3 - NON BREED SPECIALIST

Persons who have a minimum of 7 years experience in any one breed (to include 5 years in Border Collies) and have the support of the Midlands Border Collie Club.

To have judged at least 1 Breed Club Show or 4 Breed Club Supported Entry Shows. To have judged the breed in a minimum of 40 breed classes with a minimum of 200 dogs.

To have awarded Challenge Certificates in at least 1 other breed.

To have attended seminars given by KC Accredited Trainers: To have passed the relevant examination on The KC Rules and Judging Procedures and to have attended, and been given a certificate of attendance at a Conformation & Movement Seminar.

To have attended at least 2 breed specific seminars, one of which must have been run in accordance with the KC Code of Best Practice, and to have passed a judging examination/assessment.

To have bred and/or owned a minimum of 3 dogs when they gained their first entry into the KC Stud Book (save in exceptional circumstances).

To have stewarded at a minimum of 12 shows.

B List

Persons who have 4 years experience in judging Border Collies and have the support of the Midlands Border Collie Club

To have judged a minimum of 20 classes of Border Collies at Open Shows, to have judged a minimum of 80 Border Collies.

To have attended at least 1 breed specific seminar run in accordance with the KC Code of Best Practice.

C List

Aspirant judges who have shown an interest in Border Collies and have the support of the Midlands Border Collie Club. Listing would normally include persons who have judged the breed at Limit and Open Shows but who have yet to qualify for the B list.
